Iona Hassan Musical Director, studied viola at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama with James Durrant, Cathy Marwood and then in London with Philip Dukes. She has freelanced with many of the top orchestras in the UK, ran the Junior Violin Scheme at Wells Cathedral School for a number of years and is Artistic Director of the Auriga Strings.

Mark Gateshill studied Music at the University of Exeter where he led both the Symphony and Chamber Orchestras and started conducting on a regular basis. On graduating Mark took up a post as a Music assistant at Wells Cathedral School for two years. He has been the Musical Director with Frome Symphony and Winscombe Orchestras.
